

# A BRADLEY-MORRIS CASE STUDY



### **COMPANY PROFILE:**

The Electric Motor and Contracting Company, Incorporated (EMC), based in Chesapeake, Virginia, provides technical repair and maintenance services to the nuclear power industry as well as shop and field services to users of rotating electrical and mechanical equipment. The company has been in existence since 1960 and has grown from a small motor shop to being one of the largest firms of its kind on the East Coast. Their primary customers include the U.S. Navy, utility companies, paper mills, shipyards, chemical plants and hospitals.





## THE CHALLENGE

According to EMC, the company has experienced a 25-30% growth rate in the past two years.
